

Uri Bar-Lev accuser Orly Innes tells police she is being stalked and harassed

Dr. Orly Innes filed a complaint with the police yesterday, claiming that over the past two months, she had been the victim of harassment and attempts to frighten her. Innes, whose claims last autumn about then-Public Security Ministry director general Hagai Peleg and about Uri Bar-Lev, who was then a candidate for national police chief, led to the opening of investigations into both men, said that part of the efforts to scare her included the breaking into of her car and the theft of a bag containing personal documents. She also claimed that in recent months, she sensed that she was under surveillance.

Haaretz has learned that a police unit, Lahav 433, is investigating the complaints and that Innes has been in regular contact with the detectives.

Innes has reportedly told people close to her that she feels that she is in real danger and fears that she may be harmed. She refused however, when contacted yesterday by Haaretz, to make any comment on her complaints to the police.

For its part, the police also refused to respond to a question from Haaretz regarding whether the national fraud squad has been investigating, during the past few months, complaints filed by Innes.

Innes filed a complaint with the Civil Service Commission against Hagai Peleg, who, when he was the Public Security Ministry's director general, had overseen Cities Without Violence, the program that she coordinated as a consultant for the ministry. Among her com-

plaints, Innes said that Peleg harassed her and even sexually harassed her. Peleg has denied her claims.

On the basis of information received by the Justice Ministry's department for the investigation of police officers, Innes provided information on an incident that allegedly occurred at a conference in Eilat, according to which Maj. Gen. Uri Bar-Lev, former Israel police representative in the United States, harassed her.

As a result of the information provided by Innes, and even though no official complaint was filed against Bar-Lev, the department embarked on an investigation of the officer, during which additional complaints were received against him. In one complaint, he was alleged to have raped a woman at a Herzliya hotel, after she had been drugged.

In the end, the investigations department recommended to State Attorney Moshe Lador that charges should be brought against Bar-Lev for indecent assault and sexual

harassment. It also concluded that insufficient evidence existed for an indictment on rape charges.

As reported in Haaretz last week, there are currently contacts between Bar-Lev's attorney, Dori Klagsbald, and Uri Carmel, who heads the investigations department, intended to conclude the case against Bar-Lev without hav-

ing to bring the matter before a court of law. The framework deal that is being discussed includes Bar-Lev leaving the police force without his retirement package being harmed, and apologizing to Innes, in return for which the case against him will be closed.

In the exchanges with Carmel, Klagsbald argued that Bar-Lev had already paid

a heavy personal toll in the case, since he was publicly suspected of a rape that didn't take place. Moreover, the lawyer for Bar-Lev argued that there was no chance the court would convict his client of sexual offenses, even on the basis of Innes' version of events.

A meeting is scheduled to take place today between Innes

and the leadership of Carmel's department, in which the deal that is being worked out will be presented to her.

Sources close to Innes said recently that she is finding it difficult to accept the deal being worked out with Bar-Lev and that she believes that the court is the appropriate forum for the matter to be decided.

Supreme Court hears case of daughter taken from addict mother

Nine Supreme Court justices yesterday discussed one of the most complex cases to have reached their chambers in recent months: whether a 7-year-old daughter can be returned to a mother who was a drug addict. The girl had been taken from her mother and is slated for adoption.

Last August, the Tel Aviv District Court upheld a ruling by the Ramat Gan Family Court to put the girl up for adoption on the grounds that her mother is a drug addict and had also worked as a prostitute.

The mother appealed to the Supreme Court. She admitted that when her daughter was 9 months old, social welfare officials had found that her parents were unable to care for her and had taken the infant from their custody.

For the past two years, however, the mother told the court that she has refrained from using drugs, that she had returned to her family, that she had begun working regularly in a pre-school, was renting an apartment and had proven her ability

to make responsible decisions.

Prosecutors have countered that adoption is in the child's best interests and that the mother is an incompetent parent.

A panel of three Supreme Court justices ruled last November that the arguments in favor of adoption were not compelling and that social welfare officials should be able to help the mother rehabilitate.

The prosecutors objected to this ruling and asked for an additional hearing before an extended panel. In response, Supreme Court President Dorit Beinisch ordered a nine-justice panel to consider the case.

The hearing yesterday was held behind closed doors. After its completion, the mother said, "Everything is in God's hands, but I am optimistic."

The mother's attorney, Ronen Daliyahu, told Haaretz yesterday that a modern state is obligated to reach out and help a parent raise her own child.

"This is the policy around the world, and the State of Israel should strive to uphold it because blood ties have profound meaning."

K. Motzkin woman stabbed to death; police suspect husband

A 29-year-old woman was stabbed to death yesterday at her home in Kiryat Motzkin. Police suspect that Inbal Hen was killed by her husband, David Hen, 35, who later tried to commit suicide through an overdose of pills.

Because of his medical condition, police have not yet had a chance to interrogate him. His lawyer said that while his client has yet to discuss the incident with the police, "it is plausible to assume that the circumstances will speak for themselves."

Investigators said they believe that the incident was related to the husband's troubled emotional state, which worsened when he was dismissed two months ago from his job at a vehicle spare parts store in the area.

An initial investigation indicates that the husband contacted his brother after the incident, who summoned the police. The wife's body was discovered with numerous slash marks on her back. Her husband was found lying beside her corpse, and next to him were two suicide notes and pills.

Police said that there were no previous reports of violence concerning the couple, and neighbors said that the Hens, who moved into their home on Havered Street 18 months ago, were a quiet, law-abiding couple.

They were married about a year ago, and before moving to Kiryat Motzkin, lived in Eilat. Some acquaintances who knew the husband described him as a "nervous man" and said that they were aware of arguments between him and his wife. Yet Jon Schwartz, a resident of the Kiryat Motzkin building where they lived, said: "We never heard anything from their apartment. These are totally normal people who got up in the morning and went to work. We never suspected anything." Officials in the Eilat and Kiryat Motzkin municipalities confirmed that the husband and wife were not known to social welfare officials.

The husband's attorney, Udi Ganon, said: "There were economic pressures in the home, but there were no irregular incidents between the two. After [my client] was fired, his emo-

tional state degenerated, and he needed sleep. He was unable to sleep at night and couldn't function. Last Friday, he asked to be admitted to Rambam Medical Center. He was discharged, after being given medicine to control anxieties."

The attorney also suggested that his client might have been helped had it not been for the prolonged social workers strike.

Scam artist duo nabbed for selling non-existent phones

A man described by a Tel Aviv court in 2003 as a "serial fraud offender" was one of two Israeli business partners arrested by Tel Aviv police yesterday over attempts to secure investments in a disposable cell phone venture, one of several projects that police say are just covers for an elaborate scam that has attracted millions of shekels in investments from businesspeople in Israel and abroad.

Arik Klein, who is president of SafeSky Software and has served two prison terms for fraud since 1997, and Amos Bouchnik, the company's chairman, were arrested on suspi-

cion of forgery and fraud under aggravated circumstances. They will be brought before the Tel Aviv Magistrate's Court today for a remand hearing.

SafeSky says its disposable Talk & Walk cell phone is inexpensive - Klein has told investors it costs only NIS 9 and doesn't need to be insured - comes pre-paid and is made of recyclable materials. It is being marketed as a good fit for "people on the go, tourists, and thrifty spenders who want to save money on their monthly phone bills." Klein has told investors that Nokia has already invested in the project and produced two disposable phones and displayed.

Police say the whole phone enterprise is fraudulent and that none of the products described on the company website actually exist.

This isn't the first time the two have been accused of being scam artists.

In 2009 they announced that a Taiwanese company was paying \$370 million for 37 percent ownership of SafeSky's Life Keeper heart monitor patch, marketed as a patch that can warn wearers of an impending heart attack. But the deal turned out to be a hoax that fooled local and foreign businesspeople as well as former Mossad official Hagai Hadas, who served as a director of the company.

THE PRIME MINISTER'S OFFICE PUBLIC TENDER 43/10 TO SUPPLY CONSULTATION SERVICES FOR CONSOLIDATION OF AN ECONOMIC SOCIAL STRATEGY FOR THE STATE OF ISRAEL

1. The Prime Minister and the Minister of Finance have required a team headed by the National Economic Council in the Prime Minister's Office and the Ministry of Finance to lead, in cooperation with the Bank of Israel and other government ministries, a process to consolidate economic social strategy for the State of Israel (hereinafter "the process"). In order to lead this process, a team has been set up comprising the National Economic Council, the director-general of the Ministry of Finance, and the director of budgets in the Ministry of Finance (hereinafter: "the leading team").

In order to provide strategic consulting services to the leading team and assistance in constructing the economic social policy (hereinafter: "the services") the Prime Minister's Office (hereinafter: "the ministry") wishes to be in communication with the bidder whose proposal will be the best according to the conditions of this tender (hereinafter: "the winner").

2. The contract period with the winner will be 8 months from the signing day. The ministry will be entitled to extend the agreement for a period of up to six additional months.

3. Only bidders will be entitled to participate in the tender who meet all the threshold conditions detailed below:

3.1 A bidder with experience in the supply of consultation services to a foreign government and/or a state international institution, in a process of consolidation of inclusive national and/or regional economic strategy.

3.2 The bidder is a corporation incorporated in Israel or overseas and legally registered in the relevant register in Israel. It is emphasized that insofar as the bidder is a corporation - except for a partnership - that was incorporated overseas, it is required to be registered "as an overseas company" according to the legal provisions for companies, 1999. Insofar as the bidder is a partnership (including a partnership guided from outside Israel) it must be legally registered in Israel.

3.3 If the bidder is a foreign corporation that is not registered in a register in Israel, it must have representation functioning legally in Israel (hereinafter: "the Israeli representation"). The Israeli representation can be a corporation according to one of the possibilities below:

a) A corporation legally registered in Israel that the bidder controls. "Control" - as defined in the Securities Law, 1968; or
b) A corporation legally registered in Israel (hereinafter: "the representative") with whom the bidder has a valid written agreement signed at least a year before the final deadline for submission of bids in this tender, authorizing the representative to operate in the bidder's name for the supply of consultation services.

3.4 A bidder offering to supply the services by means of:
3.4.2 A person employed by the bidder; or
3.4.3 A person employed by the Israeli representation, as defined in para. 3.3 above, as long as he was employed by the bidder in the past for a period of at least two years; (hereinafter: "the senior representative").

3.5 The bidder employs at least 30 staffers;

3.6 A bidder who attaches to his bid a tender guarantee as stated in para. 13 of Section A of the tender documents;

3.7 A bidder who attaches to his bid a general plan for the supply of services as stated in para. 11 of section A of the tender documents;

3.8 A bidder who holds all the authorizations required for the purpose of carrying out the object of this tender, according to the Law for Transactions with Public Bodies, 1976;

Insofar as the bidder is a foreign corporation that is not registered in a registry in Israel, he must meet the stated condition for maintaining his Israeli representation;

3.9 A bidder whose proposed senior representative will take part in the presentation that will be held in Israel or, if he is resident in a foreign country, will take part in the presentation by means of video conference technology, in accordance with para. 12 of Section A of the tender documents.

The Central Bureau of Statistics (CBS) wishes to receive proposals for the supply of services for the security of knowledge. The services required are detailed in the tender attachments.

1. **The Services Required**
To provide support, maintenance and integration services for security knowledge products already in the CBS, including renewal of licenses and software updating, and expert technical services for initiated projects and for the solution of knowledge security problems, as the need arises and ordered ahead of time.

2. **Choice of the Winning Supplier**
The proposal that is accepted will meet the tender's threshold conditions and will have received the highest weighted mark, according to the details stated in the tender forms.

3. **Contract Period**
The contract period is from the date of signing the agreement and until December 31, 2012. The CBS retains the option to extend the period, on its own exclusive discretion, for up to an additional year. Afterwards the CBS will be able to extend the contract for another year, with the agreement of both parties.

4. **Threshold Conditions**
The bidder must meet the following conditions:

4.1 **General Threshold Conditions**

- To be a legally registered corporation
- Not to have any debts to the Companies Registrar.
- To maintain bookkeeping practices as required by law
- To have a clear record according to the Law of Foreign Workers and the Law for Minimum Wages.
- To be (itself or a sub-supplier) an authorized representative of the manufacturer of the products it proposes.

4.2 **Professional Threshold Conditions**

- The bidder must have at least 5 years' experience in the provision of services of operation and assistance in the security of lateral knowledge in organizations of a size similar to the CBS.
- The bidder must support and maintain at least 10 clients in the sphere of knowledge security in Israel, for a year in the last five years. In addition, it must serve for at least one client (with at least 500 users) as the main supplier of knowledge security, operating in the last three years.
